He earned a Government Executive Institute Certificate from the School of Business at University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill.

Employment History/Professional Experience:

Mr. Dudley began his professional career as Assistant to the President of Lenoir Community College in Kinston. After a two-year stint in the Office of State Personnel in Raleigh, he was named an Administrative Staff Aide in the Governor's Office of Minority Affairs. From 1981 to 1993, he was Executive Director of the Inmate Grievance Resolution Board for the Department of Correction. He was named as Assistant Secretary in 1993 of the N.C. Dept. of Crime Control & Public Safety, and oversaw the divisions of Victim and Justice Services, Crime Prevention, Emergency Management and the Governor's Crime Commission. Mr. Dudley is presently Chief Deputy Secretary of the N.C. Dept. of Crime Control & Public Safety. Under his management are the divisions of Butner Public Safety, the Governor's Crime Commission, and Victim Compensation Services.
